1. A PLACE TO CONNECT.

3. A PLACE TO GROW.


Groups are a community of people you can grow with to become more like Jesus and reach the full potential God has put inside you.

We have compiled a collection of 10 week, curriculum-based classes that focus on the Five Pillars of Health. The curriculum for these groups will be chosen by the Zeal Groups Team and led by Zeal Groups Team members. Grow Groups have the following areas of focus:

1. FOUNDATIONS

Focused on deepening our understanding of firmly planting the core building blocks of our faith.

2. FREEDOM

Equipping you to live in the victory of God's love, and freeing yourself from the burdens and sins of the past.

3. FAMILY & RELATIONSHIPS

Focusing specifically on the spiritual health of friendships, relationships, marriage, and children.

4. FINANCES

Learn how to steward God's financial blessings well by not only providing for yourself and your family, but also allowing you to give generously.

5. FITNESS

Learn what the Bible says about fitness for your entire self, body, mind, and soul while focusing on your physical health with accountability.

HOW DO I STRUCTURE MY ZEAL GROUP?

A great Zeal Group has a PLAN that includes time for:

1. CASUAL CONVERSATION

Spend time building relationships and getting to know each other.

2. ACTIVITY

This will vary based on what kind of group you're leading. It could be an activity like frisbee, an outreach, or a video curriculum.

3. SPIRITUAL COMPONENT/DISCUSSION

The Word

This can be as simple as sharing something God is teaching you with the group or engaging the group in a discussion with open-ended questions.

Worship

Have worship music playing in the background or share a playlist to lead them in worship throughout the week.

Prayer

Ask for prayer requests from group members and pray at the beginning and/or the end of each group meeting.

ZEAL GROUPS ARE NOT A PLACE FOR:

- Conducting business
- Collecting offerings
- Introducing unapproved materials or speakers
- Discussing controversial topics
- Alcohol

SOME GUIDELINES THAT HELP US BUILD HEALTHY ZEAL GROUPS INCLUDE:

- 1. SET EXPECTATIONS.
- 2. BE PREPARED.
- 3. CONSISTENCY IS CRITICAL.

4. FOLLOW THE 80/20 TALKING RULE.

80% of talking should come from members and only 20% from a leader.

5. KEEP THE DISCUSSION POSITIVE.

6. STEER THE DISCUSSION SO EVERYONE CAN PARTICIPATE.

Everyone is at a different place in their journey with Christ and may not grasp terms we consider common (i.e. "spiritual warfare").

7. BUILD HEALTHY BOUNDARIES.

We understand that not all co-ed groups will have a male and female leader. We encourage you to seek guidance from your coach or the pastoral care team should you find a group member needing guidance.

ZEAL ENVIRONMENTS

We prepare rooms with everything someone would need, before they even knew they needed it.

HOW TO SET A ROOM

- · TV is on with a graphic
- · Lights are on
- Music is playing
- · Room smells good (candles are lit)
- Seating is set up for the audience (set out the amount of chairs you expect to fill, no seat should be empty)
- · We are generous with our resources, we set out more than we need
- · We send out agendas ahead of time
- Rooms are set up at least 15 minutes before anyone arrives

HOW TO RESET A ROOM

- Furniture is put back in its original place
- Surfaces are wiped down with Clorox wipes
- · All trash is collected from the room and thrown away
- Garbage is taken all the way to the dumpster
- New garbage bag is put in trash can
- · Room is vacuumed
- · Candles are blown out
- · Lights & electronics are turned off
- Doors are locked



WHAT IS THE WIN?

1. WINNING LOOKS LIKE CARING.

As leaders, we can outwardly show that we care by:

- Following up with our group members individually, especially if they've confided in you about struggles or victories
- "Be sure you know the condition of your flocks, give careful attention to your herds."
 - Proverbs 27:23
- Challenging those group members who are experiencing spiritual warfare with truth in love
- Being the light and the voice of encouragement

As leaders, we can show loyalty by:

- · Outwardly expressing our belief in one another's potential
- Keeping total confidence in conversations (don't gossip)

If someone is in a crisis and has publicly shared their struggle with the group, rally the group in support. Use wisdom and be sensitive, because it is an honor to walk with people through difficult times. As a leader, you have a support system walking with you too. Don't be afraid to seek guidance from your coaches. Always remember, we do not have to fix people—we point them to the One who can.

When you feel like you don't know how to help someone in your group, remember: **ESPN**

E: Encourage

S: Share Scripture


P: Pray

2. WINNING LOOKS LIKE GROWTH

The primary role of a group leader is to help members understand and take full advantage of their unique walk with Christ.



People in your group will be at different places in their spiritual lives and each person will have different steps to take to deepen their relationship with Christ. As a leader, you may find it appropriate to encourage members of your group to grow in specific disciplines as a stepping-stone in their walk.

- Attending Sunday Services
- Joining the Dream Team
- Serving with our Outreach Team

LEADERSHIP ESSENTIALS

1. LEAD WITH OTHERS IN MIND BY:

- · Praying daily
- · Connecting outside of the group
- Creating a fun, life-giving environment
- · Sharing the load (co-leader)
- · Respecting people's time (start/stop on time)
- Inviting people to growth



2. PRAY FOR YOUR GROUP PRAYER IS THE FOUNDATION OF OUR CHURCH

- Pray for requests from group members.
- Ask for the Holy Spirit's presence in your group.
- Pray God will open people's hearts to His truth.
- Pray for authentic community in the group.
- Pray for wisdom and strength to lead your group well, and protection for your family.

COACHES

Group Coaches are the support system for all of our Group Leaders. For each group leader they:

- Contact you at the beginning of the semester to give you their information
- · Care for you as needs arise in your life
- Support you as a point of contact for questions or situations that arise with members
- Encourage you
- Pray for you, providing additional spiritual covering
